Internet litigation involves a case with one or more claims brought under one of the following federal statutes: (i) the Computer Fraud and Abuse Act (CFAA), (ii) the Digital Millennium Copyright Act (DMCA), or (iii) the Electronic Communications Privacy Act (ECPA) which includes the Stored Communications Act (SCA). Note that this case type does not include claims for copyright infringement, which are occasionally brought under the DMCA; these claims are part of our copyright practice area.



This is an emerging area of law focused on high-stakes, high-tech disputes. It is an important area of law in which transparency and understanding are crucial.
